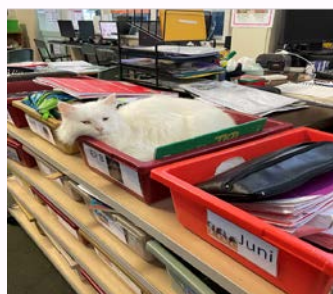

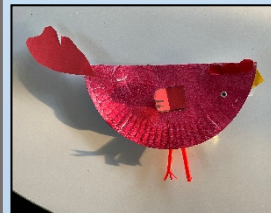
The remainder of this term will see us do a book study. The book for this term is Holes.
